


Red River Valley Dulcimer Club



Keynote: Climate Change: a Challenge for Our Time

Dr. Kisselle will address common questions about climate change and effects it is having on plant life and wildlife in the Texoma area. He will also discuss ways that ordinary citizens can prepare for and help address climate change.

Dr. Keith Kisselle, is an Associate Professor of Biology and Academic Chair of Environmental Studies at Austin College. Dr. Kisselle has been at Austin College for 12 years, teaching Ecosystem Ecology, Fundamentals of Environmental Studies, and Globalization, among other courses. Currently, he is researching nutrient cycling and the soil microbial community associated with prairie restoration in North Texas. He earlier did research with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, focusing on how land use changes and climate change affected Brazilian grasslands.



Garden for Birds and Butterflies

This workshop will answer some very basic questions: What is a "green" Garden? Why go "green"? How to make your garden attractive to Birds and Butterflies? You will learn Resources for the "green" garden.

Dick and Sue Malnory have been volunteering at Hagerman NWR since 2004. Dick is a life-long birder and Sue a life-long gardener. They have lived in Sherman since 1969 and transformed their home landscape from sub-divided farmland into a tree shaded landscape, primarily using native trees transplanted from a creek area on the property. They enjoy watching the endless parade of birds at their feeders now.

Last year Dick obtained approval for the Friends of Hagerman to install a Butterfly Garden at the Refuge, and that project nearly complete now. Dick has served as the general contractor for the project, designed by Roger Sanderson, Director of Horticulture for the Texas Discovery Garden. The quarter-acre garden is planted with Texas natives known to provide a host of nectar for butterflies, and includes a water feature, teaching circle, and shaded seating areas.




How to build a Tower Garden
